

Exeter Road Community Primary School

Pupil Premium Statement 2013-14

In the 2014-15 financial year Exeter Road received **£97,700** of additional funding to help support children in receipt of free school meals. Some of the things that this funding contributed to providing for pupils was:

- Access to our outdoor education programme for designated periods across the year.
- 50% discount from the cost of the Year 3, 4, 5 and 6 residential for pupils in receipt of free school meals.
- 50% contributions for other school trips (some trips free) for pupils in receipt of free school meals.
- Access to gifted and talented events and activities.
- A Reading Recovery Teacher (Mrs Gosling)
- A Numbers Count Teacher (Mrs Ingham)
- A Children & Families Co-ordinator (Miss Cracknell)
- Our Outdoor Education programme, led by Mr Clarke.

What have we achieved so far?

Our interventions in this area have resulted in improvements to the performance of this group of children. Pupil premium data for Year 6 pupils in national assessment 2014 results (from RAISE Online 2014):

- 64% of FSM children achieved level 4 in English and Maths combined
- 64% of FSM children achieved level 4 in Maths
- 73% of FSM children achieved level 4 in Reading
- 73% of FSM children achieved level 4 in Writing
- The Value Added (VA) score for FSM children in 2014 was 98.6
- The VA score for FSM children in Maths in 2014 was 99.5
- The VA score for FSM children in Reading in 2014 was 96.2
- The VA score for FSM children in Writing in 2014 was 99.3

The impact for this year's results is not as good as the previous year (2013) but there are reasons for this specific to the 2014 Year 6 cohort. As always the school has plans to improve these the impact of our work.
